How are you promoting the SDGs:

When given an opportunity to raise awareness, such as shopping, dining, visiting businesses in and around our community of Simcoe County / Central Ontario I have discussed the importance of improving our performance metrics within each of the SDGs. As women, as Canadians, as residents of Ontario and locally within our own smaller communities each effort has a ripple effect worldwide – when we do better with what we have, where we are, with the people we cross paths with - we all do better. Examples:

Food Scarcity – ensuring that food in our community is affordable, accessible, produced and marketed with less waste, with best recovery models to support food banks.

Water - being aware of what we are allowing into our water systems – fewer chemicals, conserve fresh water, ensure everyone has access to clean drinking water, protect our watershed communities.

Waster – being aware of producing less waste, environmentally safer options, recycled products.

Discussion with Hair Stylist – their chosen vegan (and without cruelty to animals) brand of hair care products is produced with less water, less waste, fewer harsh chemicals and uses end-product biodegradable packaging.

- I also appeared for 30 minutes on Cogeco TV discussing BPW as well as our big fundraiser...this interview on TV was shown four times in that month...
- I also arranged for a moving banner to run along the bottom of the TV screen advertising BPW
- I asked for marketing help and was given \$2000.00 of marketing in the local Niagara region newspapers to advertise BPW
- I also designed a "thank you" add (donated payment) to thank everyone for their support for BPW NF and our fundraiser...this ad will run Wed May 23 in COLOUR in 3 major local papers.!

Key Accomplishments this year (if applicable):

The timing of the speaker series (dates were not of my choice), need to be addressed as the Tuesdays chosen for my series fell on the meeting days of the bigger clubs and they usually already have their speakers chosen. The purpose was to help smaller clubs by providing them with speakers that I had arranged for them to view via zoom. To arrange a new series, more attention must be addressed to the meeting schedules of the various clubs.

\$500 Bursary created by BPW NF for senior girls looking at STEM careers at the Regional Science & Engineering Fair. BPW NF judged the senior girls and were invited back several days later to present our bursary & certificate to the winner and much to our delight, the OVERALL WINNER of that age/grade division happened to also be the young lady that we BPW ladies chose. She was working with cancer cells and wanted to develop a NEW standard baseline since current researchers are using a baseline built in the 1960s for cancer research.

All of our meetings remained via zoom and we decided that **all winter months will be done on zoom as we have members coming from a long distance.** June will be our first face-to-face meeting and then we will host an OPEN HOUSE in September 2023

I do not know where the pins are ordered, or if there is a minimum quantity to order. The prices to order these items may have gone up since they were last ordered.

The double wall tumbler with straw is easily damaged and, as can be seen in the inventory, because it comes in three pieces, it is easy for pieces to become lost.

The flip phone cases are out of date and do not fit any current phones.

The waterproof cell phone cases have proved to unpopular.

There seem to be three categories of items:

- 1. BPW pins (easily and affordably mailed)
- 2. Items that may be of interest to members but that are costly to mail
- 3. Items that are not desirable/not selling well

The BPW Ontario board should have a discussion and decide what to do regarding the different categories of items.
